



Porsche secures third straight world championship title with the 919 Hybrid

05/11/2017 Porsche has crowned the 919 Hybrid's career with a third consecutive Manufacturers' World Championship title. A second and third place finish at the Shanghai 6-hour race on Sunday produced an early title decision at round eight of nine on the FIA World Endurance Championship WEC calendar.

At the same time, Earl Bamber (NZ), Timo Bernhard (DE) and Brendon Hartley (NZ) clinched the drivers' title. The Porsche 919 Hybrid has netted six world championships, three outright Le Mans wins, a total of 17 race wins including seven double victories, 19 pole positions and twelve fastest race laps from 33 races.

Michael Steiner, Board Member for Research and Development at Porsche AG: "Three manufacturers' world championship titles and three Le Mans victories for the Porsche 919 Hybrid are confirmation of our initial bold decision to attempt something totally new. Especially in regard to battery technology,

downsizing, efficiency improvements with the turbocharged petrol engine and, in particular, for energy recovery systems. We didn't look for role models, instead we struck out on our own path. Only by doing this could we create such a strong package, which has enabled us to make huge progress on the racetrack and in our technical development centre."
