US star at the Porsche Driving Instruction Session

Matt Kuchar revving up

Stuttgart/Hamburg. Full speed ahead into the 2019 Porsche European Open: US golfer Matt Kuchar had an eventful start to the tournament week, getting a unique experience to put a Porsche sports car to the test.

Driving around the ADAC Driving Safety Centre in Luneburg just south of Hamburg, the nine-time US PGA Tour winner put the limits of his driving skills to the test in a Porsche 911 GT3 RS, and in doing so felt "like a kid again."

Kuchar was also impressed by his Porsche driving instructor Jussi Kumpumäki. Sitting in the passenger seat, the golfer got first-hand experience of the 520 bhp vehicle's racing capabilities. "These cars are made to race," said the American. After a number of drifts and a slick slalom run, the professional driver was also full of praise for Kuchar saying, "Matt really surprised me. He did very well indeed."
