### [4] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #4) vs. Veronika Kudermetova (#19)

## Rybakina leads 3-0

Rybakina and Kudermetova are facing off for the fourth time on the Tour; their most recent previous encounter being at 2021 Chicago Fall Tennis Classic in straight sets... **Rybakina** making third main-draw appearance at Stuttgart, where she has previously fallen in the 2r twice in 2023 (I. Haddad Maia via ret.) and in 2022 (I. Badosa)... **Rybakina** is looking to play her seventh QF of the 2024 season following Brisbane, Adelaide, Abu Dhabi, Doha, Budai and Miami... **Kudermetova** has beaten Barbora Krejcikova in a three-set contest so far this week to reach R16 and equal her best result at Stuttgart since 2018... **Kudermetova** owns a title on clay court (d. Kovinic) at Charleston 2021... **Kudermetova** is looking for her seventeenth career win over Top 10 players, most recently defeating No.2 Iga Swiatek at Tokyo 2023

## [1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs. Elise Mertens (BEL #30)

### **First Meeting**

**Swiatek** is making her third main-draw appearance at Stuttgart, where her best results were winning the titles back-to-back in 2023 and in 2022, both times defeating A. Sabalenka... **Swiatek** is No.1 seed this week, this being her 32nd tournament in her career at the top seed... **Swiatek** is looking to play her fourth QF of the 2024 season having reached such round at Doha, Dubai and Indian Wells... **Mertens** has beaten Tatjana Maria in a three-setter so far this week to reach her first-ever R16 at Stuttgart... **Mertens** owns 11 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently defeating No.3 Jessica Pegula at Roland Garros in 2023... **Mertens** is set to face the World No.1 for the third time in her career, having previously faced and fallen to then No.1 Halep at Madrid and Roland Garros in 2018

## Jasmine Paolini (ITA #14) vs. [7] Ons Jabeur (TUN #9)

### Jabeur leads 2-0

Paolini is seeking her fourth win over a Top 10 player...Paolini will reach a career-high of World No.13 after this week, regardless of the result today...Paolini is ranked second on Tour in break point conversion percentage (55.3%)...Jabeur snapped a five-game losing streak with her win over Alexandrova in the previous round...Jabeur has reached a clay-court final in each of her last three seasons (Charleston 2023, Madrid 2022, Charleston 2022, Charleston 250 2021)...With a win today, Jabeur will have her second Top 20 victory of the season, after defeating Alexandrova in the previous round

## [WC] Emma Raducanu (GBR #303) vs. Linda Noskova (CZE #31) Raducanu leads 1-0

**Raducanu** will reach her second career Stuttgart quarterfinal with a win over Noskova...Excluding Billie Jean King Cup qualification matches, a win today would give **Raducanu** her best win by ranking since defeating Dayana Yastremska at Indian Wells 2024...**Raducanu** won the pairs' only previous matchup at Roland Garros 2022...**Noskova** has hit 96 aces so far in 2024, 10<sup>th</sup>-most on Tour...**Noskova** is looking for her first quarterfinal appearance since the Australian Open 2024, where she lost to Dayana Yastremska...With a win today, **Noskova** will reach her first-ever quarterfinal on clay courts...

## **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Reached second Grand Slam final at 2023
   Australian Open (l. Sabalenka in 3s); made Top 10 debut following tournament (January 30,
   2023). Also in 2023 won first two WTA 1000 title
   at Indian Wells and Rome and finished R-Up at
   Miami. Qualified for first WTA Finals, going 1-2 in
   Group Stage.
- Lifted maiden major at 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F)
- In 2022 also finished R-Up at Adelaide (l. Barty) and Portoroz (l. Siniakova)
- Best result of 2021 were SFs at Eastbourne, Olympics and Chicago [500], and QFs at Abu Dhabi, Roland Garros, San Jose and Ostrava
- Opened 2020 season by reaching the championship match at four of her first five tournaments, including a title run at Hobart (d. Zhang in F)
- Made first final appearance at a Premier-level tournament with R-Up finish at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); was rewarded with Top 20 debut at No.19 following run in Russia (February 17, 2020)
- First win over a Top-5 ranked opponent came over No.3 Ka.Pliskova during R-Up finish at 2020 Dubai
- Won back-to-back Slam matches for the first time during 3r showing at 2020 Australian Open (l. Barty)
- Won maiden WTA singles title at 2019 Bucharest (d. Tig in F), breaking into Top 100 for the first time in the following week's rankings at No.65 (July 22, 2019)
- Also in 2019, went on to make Top 50 debut on September 16, 2019, after reaching second career final at Nanchang (l. Peterson), produced SF appearances at Luxembourg and 's-Hertogenbosch, and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros, falling 1r (as qualifier, l. Siniakova)
- Finished 2019 campaign with 57-21 win-loss record (across all levels) to end season at No.37, up from 2018's final ranking of No.191. On the ITF Circuit in 2019, lifted silverware on three occasions: back-to-back at \$25k Moscow-RUS and \$25k Kazan-RUS, and at \$60k ITF/Launceston-AUS
- Highlights of 2018 included reaching maiden WTA QF at St. Petersburg (l. Goerges) and clinching title at \$15k ITF/Kazan-RUS
- First Top 10 win came over No.7 Garcia at 2018
   St. Petersburg
- Made WTA qualifying and main draw debut at 2017 Moscow (as qualifier, l. Begu in 1r)

- Won second career title at 2023 Tokyo (d. Pegula in F) and finished R-Up at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Alexandrova in F); ended year at No.19 for second straight Top 20 year-end ranking
- Also in 2023, reached SF at Adelaide 2, Doha, Madrid and Rome; qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai going 1-1 in group play
- In doubles, won titles in 2023 at Dubai with Liudmila Samsonova and Zhuhai with Beatriz Haddad Maia
- Made Top 10 debut in singles on October 24, 2022, following QF run at Guadalajara 1000 and Top 10 debut in doubles on January 31, 2022 ending the year at No.2
- Singles highlights in 2022 were R-Up finishes at Melbourne Summer Set 1 (l. Halep), Dubai (l. Ostapenko) and Istanbul (l. Potapova), and reached maiden Grand Slam QF at Roland Garros (l. Kasatkina)
- Won doubles title at 2022 WTA Finals in Fort Worth with partner Elise Mertens; also won title at Dubai and 's-Hertogenbosch with Mertens as well as Rome with Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova
- Appeared in maiden WTA final at Abu Dhabi in opening event of 2021 (l. Sabalenka) before securing first title at Charleston (d. Kovinic)
- In doubles won title at Istanbul with Elise Mertens and made final at Wimbledon (w/Vesnina) and Indian Wells (w/Rybakina) Scored first win over a Top-3 ranked opponent by upsetting No.3 Karolina Pliskova at 2020 Cincinnati. Other highlights in 2020 included SF run at Hobart and closing out season with backto-back QFs at Ostrava and Linz
- Won 27 main-draw matches during 2019 had previously won six across entire career - to rise over 60 places in the WTA rankings, making Top-100 debut on February 4 and Top-50 debut on September 9
- Singles highlights in 2019 included reaching SF at 's-Hertogenbosch, Hiroshima and Tianjin and 3r at Roland Garros where she defeated No.13 Caroline Wozniacki in 1r - her maiden Grand Slam main draw win and first over a Top-20 opponent)
- Also in 2019, won WTA 125K Series title at Guadalajara (d. Bouzkova in F) and entered Top 50 on Sept 9, 2019
- Posted first two Top 10 wins of career in final weeks of 2019, over No.10 Belinda Bencic at Wuhan and No.4 Elina Svitolina at Moscow

## CAREER MILESTONES

- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak - jointlongest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
