



# A year of milestones: Porsche 2025 in review

## The most dynamic 911 Carrera S ever

A product innovation to kick off the year: Porsche is adding the new Carrera S to the 911 model lineup. With enhanced performance and driving dynamics, it noticeably surpasses the predecessor model. A significant power upgrade and additional equipment options offer significant added value compared to the 911 Carrera.

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## Porsche claims 20th victory at the 24 Hours of Daytona

Porsche Penske Motorsport has clinched its second consecutive victory at the 24 Hours of Daytona. Last year's winner Felipe Nasr from Brazil, Nick Tandy from the United Kingdom, and Laurens Vanthoor from Belgium steered the number 7 Porsche 963 to the top step of the podium.

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## Porsche AG initiates long-planned change to its Executive Board

Porsche AG initiates a long-planned change to its Executive Board: on 26 February 2025, Dr. Jochen Breckner will take over responsibility for Finance and IT, with Matthias Becker becoming responsible for Sales and Marketing. They succeed Lutz Meschke and Detlev von Platen, who are leaving the company by mutual agreement.

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## Porsche News now also available via WhatsApp

The sports car manufacturer from Zuffenhausen is further expanding its online communications, with two new channels on WhatsApp sharing regular news updates from the world of Porsche.

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## Porsche AG records robust results in a challenging environment

Porsche AG ended the 2024 financial year with a robust result in a challenging environment. The sports car manufacturer marked record sales in four out of five regions of the world, as well as strong automotive net cashflow, which almost reached the record levels of 2023.

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## Porsche is modernising its PCM: greater performance and new features

Porsche is improving the digital user experience in the 911, Taycan, Panamera and Cayenne model series for the change of the model year. The fundamentally revised Porsche Communication Management (PCM) system is more performant and offers access to the Porsche App Center. Other

new features include Dolby Atmos® for an improved sound experience, the Amazon Alexa® digital assistant and an expanded Porsche Connect package.

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## **Porsche has been manufacturing in Zuffenhausen for 75 years**

The first Porsche 356 produced in Germany was completed on 6 April 1950, marking the beginning of an extraordinary success story. Over decades, Zuffenhausen became the centre of Porsche sports car production. Engines, electric drives and the individualisation of customer vehicles are also manufactured here.

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## **Porsche 911 Spirit 70: a unique feeling of freedom and joie de vivre**

Exclusive Olive Neo colour, historically inspired decorative graphics and legendary Pasha pattern in the interior: Porsche presents the 911 Spirit 70 at the Shanghai Auto Show, a convertible limited to 1,500 units that embodies the essence of the 1970s and early 1980s.

As Porsche prepares for the 24 Hours of Le Mans, a sister to the 963 Hypercar has been revealed – named the 963 RSP. Based on the champion of the IMSA and WEC racing series, this one-off creation draws inspiration from a truly iconic Porsche 917.

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## Top results for Porsche at the 24 Hours of Le Mans

The number 6 Porsche 963 from Porsche Penske Motorsport finished the 24 Hours of Le Mans in second place. In a highly exciting battle for overall victory, Matt Campbell, Kévin Estre and Laurens Vanthoor were just 14.084 seconds behind the victorious Ferrari. In the LMGT3 category, Team Manthey celebrated its second class victory in a row after 2024 with the Porsche 911 GT3 R.

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## Porsche Cayenne displays its full bandwidth at Goodwood

The Cayenne, Porsche's most versatile model, took centre stage with several major appearances at this year's Goodwood Festival of Speed. Among the highlights was the upcoming Cayenne Electric offering a first glimpse of its impressive dynamic capabilities on the legendary Goodwood hill.

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## Teams' and manufacturers' titles secured for Porsche at season finale

Porsche has won the Teams' and Manufacturers' ABB FIA Formula E World Championships. This completes the set of titles in Formula E after Pascal Wehrlein was crowned Drivers' World Champion last season.

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## **Porsche Leipzig plant wins Automotive Lean Production Award 2025**

The Porsche Leipzig plant has been awarded this year's Automotive Lean Production Award in the OEM category. The production site in Saxony impressed the expert jury and successfully brought the prestigious accolade to Leipzig.

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## **Porsche AG continues generational change to its Executive Board**

Porsche AG is continuing the long-planned generational change to its Executive Board. On 19 August 2025, Vera Schalwig will assume responsibility for the Human Resources and Social Affairs division, succeeding Andreas Haffner. At the same time, Joachim Scharnagl will take over the Procurement division from Barbara Frenkel.

The factory team's two Porsche 963 prototypes finished the season finale at Road Atlanta in third and tenth place, enough to secure the manufacturers title once again. Former Porsche Juniors Matt Campbell from Australia and Mathieu Jaminet clinched drivers' honours, while Porsche Penske Motorsport claimed the team championship for the second year running.
