

## 911 R: Spectacular press response

**13/03/2016** At the Geneva Motor Show it has been attracting great attention — and been a hot topic in the media; the new 911 R.

Puristic. Classic. Emotional. The 911 R is cut back to the essentials. Pull straps as internal door openers, full bucket seats made of carbon and no rear seat. The result is a total weight of just 1,370 kilograms. Motorsport feeling included — thanks not least to the drive system. With its 368 kW (500 hp, fuel consumption/emission levels\* combined 13.3 I/100 km; CO2 emissions: 308 g/km) four-litre, naturally aspirated flat engine and six-speed sports transmission, the 911 R follows in the tradition of the historic vehicle by which it is inspired: a street-legal racing car from 1967.
